100 Women Who Care of the North Shore



Initiated in 2014 by Nancy Farran, Fanny Patterson Susan Beck and Delaina Bell of the West Vancouver Foundation, 100 Women Who Care of the North Shore is designed to make an immediate, direct, and positive impact on this community. They bring together 100+ women on Vancouver's North Shore (North and West Vancouver), who care about local community priorities and the charitable organizations working hard to address these. They gather for just one hour four times a year. At each quarterly meeting, members jointly select a local charity and each person donates \$100 to the selected organization and today, \$142,950 has been granted to community organizations.

In December 2020, the group's 2nd largest donation of \$10,500 was given to North Shore Crisis Services Society – SAGE Transition House. SAGE, nominated by member Bev Porter, is an 18-bed transition house that provides safety and support to women and their children fleeing abusive situations.

Feed the Need

The COVID-19 pandemic brought to light a genuine need among this community's most vulnerable seniors, who lacked the means to access regular meals. The West Vancouver Seniors Activity Centre was at the heart of the rapid response, ensuring that 350 seniors received (and will continue to receive) 3 nutritious meals a week.

In November 2020, with a generous matching donation through the Ian and Rosemary Mottershead Fund at the West Vancouver Foundation, a fundraising campaign was launched to bring the program from a hand-to-mouth existence to achieving funding and program security. Within a 10 week period, an overwhelming 480 community donations were received, ensuring this program can continue to feed vulnerable seniors in West Vancouver for all of 2021 and beyond.

Bonnie J McLaren Memorial Fund

The fund was opened in honour of our mother, Bonnie, who passed away in 2010 after a battle with cancer. Bonnie was a dedicated member of the Soroptimists International, working on initiatives in support of helping women and girls on the North Shore. To honour the memory of Bonnie, the family decided to open this fund and continue to support the programs Bonnie had valued.

Bonnie was raised and schooled in West Vancouver. After marrying our father Andy, they built a home in North Vancouver and raised three children, Craig, Brent, and Tricia. After Bonnie passed our family wanted to set up a memorial fund in her honour. Given her ties to West Van and that many of her friends and fellow Soroptomists lived there, we felt that the WVF was the best option.

Our family recognizes the strong impact the fund has had and it has inspired us to reach out further and support needs of women of all ages on the North Shore. It is meaningful that we can come together as a family and review requests from many worthwhile causes, to provide as much support as possible. Bonnie was truly passionate about helping and we are honoured to continue her legacy of giving back.

Denning-Chunn Family Fund


