Foundry North Shore

YOUTH & PARENT WELLNESS PROGRAMS

Requesting \$5,500

Foundry North Shore is a multi-service wellness center for youth 12 - 24 years old. Core services include mental health and substance use counselling, primary care medical services, peer support, parent navigation and other social services. We have 2 projects we are fundraising for:

PARENT EDUCATION SERIES: Foundry would like to host quarterly community conversations with parents of youth, struggling with mental health or substance use issues.

GARDENING FOR GREATNESS: Foundry has a small outdoor patio that holds great potential to house a therapeutic garden, including vegetables, herbs and flowers. With staff support, youth will plant and nurture the garden together.

VULNERABLE SENIORS SUPPORT

Requesting \$20,000

Since 2004, Hollyburn Family Services Society has been working and advocating to ensure youth, seniors, adults and families are safe from violence, that marginalized youth have access to the resources they require and youth, seniors and families have sustainable and affordable housing.

Many North and West Vancouver seniors are experiencing homelessness for the first time ever. Sadly, it is not unusual to meet an 80 year old living in her vehicle, or a senior veteran accessing the local shelter. Every year through our Seniors at Housing Risk Program, we help hundreds of seniors who are aging into homelessness or at severe risk of housing loss. No senior should be worried about their housing and because of Hollyburn Family Services Society, all they need to do is reach out.

Howe Sound Biosphere Region Initiative Society

SEARCHING FOR SLHAWT'
(HERRING) in the Squamish Nation territory

Requesting \$15,000

Howe Sound Biosphere Trust facilitates and supports the organizing and planning of complex activities that bring allegiance to balancing development, conservation, and equity in the Átl'ka7tsem/Howe Sound region. In September 2021 we become Canada's 19th UNESCO Biosphere Region.

This project involves advancing Indigenous youth leadership, ocean exploration, and cultural teachings in Átl'ka7tsem/Howe Sound. The Marine Reference Guide - a project of the Make Way Charitable Society, Howe Sound Biosphere Region and Skwxwú7mesh Uxwumixw (Squamish Nation) are partnering to study and share the activity of slhawt'/herring within the Nation's territory. Together we will seek to answer the following questions: 1) where and when do slhawt' spawn; 2) how well do their eggs (ch'em'esh) survive in different locations; and 3) what is the cultural and social importance of slhawt' and ch'em'esh to the Skwxwú7mesh Stélmexw (Squamish people)? Our desired outcome is to increase Átl'ka7tsem/Howe Sound's capacity to protect both ocean health and Skwxwú7mesh culture. howesoundbri.org

HELICOPTER NIGHT HOISTING CAPABILITY

Requesting \$100,000

2021 has been an unprecedented year for North Shore Rescue. As of mid-October, we have responded to a staggering 188 calls with the busy winter season yet to arrive. We operate in a challenging geographic location with minimal ground access in many areas. Helicopters are frequently used with great success to streamline our response. Helicopters reduce response times drastically, provide faster care to patients, reduce the number of resources required, and reduce the risk and exposure to ground teams. Many of the subjects may not have survived without the visual perspective provided to searchers from the air and the amount of terrain that could be efficiently searched in a short time. As a team, North Shore Rescue is continually evolving and seeking ways to provide the best and most efficient care to injured or lost subjects. To further expand on our existing capabilities and skills, NSR seeks to combine both the hoisting and night vision disciplines. By doing so, NSR would have the ability to efficiently insert members into challenging terrain and extract subjects in the dark by air. NSR wishes to continue our evolution in helicopter rescue and is seeking funding that will allow us to expand our hoisting capabilities into the nighttime. northshorerescue.

FEED THE NEED - SENIORS FOOD SECURITY

Requesting \$100,000

The Seniors' Activity Centre's meal program began as the COVID-19 pandemic brought to light a genuine need among this community's most vulnerable seniors, who lacked the means to access regular meals. The Feed the Need program currently serves 710 meals per week, improving many lives. Feed the Need provides 3 meals a week to vulnerable seniors who are struggling with food security and without family or community support to help. This program provides a nutritious meal, that they would not otherwise have access too. The meals are delivered direct to the door, packaged and delivered by volunteers, that take the time to check and care for each senior!
