

ACT OF KINDNESS

December 2021 saw the YPC organize an 'Act of Kindness' event where West Vancouver youth came together to make holiday cards and gift bags for vulnerable youth on the North Shore in partnership with Enhance West Van and sponsored by WVF Small Neighbourhood Grants Program and generous donors.

ENVIRONMENT CAMPAIGN

Launched via social media and the 100 Youth Who Care events, this ongoing initiative promotes awareness on the effects of climate change through sharing knowledge and tips on how youth can make positive changes in their daily actions.

100 YOUTH WHO CARE

Building on the momentum from 2020, the YPC granted a total of \$8,000 to nine charities over the course of the 3 events held virtually during 2021. Charity pitches made to attendees at these events highlighted financial need for youth programming and initiatives in the areas of Mental Health, Environment and Social Well-being.

GIVE Where You Live 2021 - results are in!

Give Where You Live is The Foundation's online community granting program for local charitable organizations. We are pleased to announce that thanks to Fundholder and community support, GIVE Where You Live 2021 raised more than \$200,000 for 7 local charities. The Rosemary and Ian Mottershead Fund created the initial match of \$65,000. With the 2021 campaign the community generously donated \$135,559, and the Ian & Rosemary Mottershead Fund matched \$65,500, resulting in \$200,559 to the 7 charity partners!


THE IMPERIAL FUND
