The West Vancouver Foundation acknowledges that the land on which we live and work is the unceded traditional territories of the Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish), Səlílwəta?/Selilwitulh (Tsleil-Waututh), and xwməθkwəyəm (Musqueam) Nations and we are grateful for the opportunity to do so. FORTY YEARS. And what a difference. In 1979, I made the leap from Montreal to West Vancouver. It was a time when the streets were a bit quieter but the sea walk was already well used. When local shops were closed on Sundays AND Mondays. Forty years ago a few of the leading philanthropists and community builders of West Vancouver got together and established their own West Vancouver community foundation. They could see that as our community was growing and changing, there was an opportunity to harness the generosity within the community, for local good, forever.

Over those forty years, the world became more complex. Words entered our lexicon like "collaboration" and now, notably, "pivot". Your community foundation has been doing a great job of both.

COLLABORATION. We have built deep ties with North Shore charities over the years and have shifted our focus from simply a cheque writer to one of collaborator and partner. I am proud to say that today we have strong relationships with many of the excellent organizations serving the North Shore – charities, non-profits, local government, business entrepreneurs and corporations. More recently we have provided leadership and organizational management training through the Sea to Sky community including Bowen, Squamish, Whistler and the Sunshine Coast. We are an active member of Community Foundations of Canada, an umbrella organization that serves to further the role of each of us with creativity and vision. We continue to work with many community partners as we research and produce our Vital Signs reports – from the police to health authorities to educators and those representing a variety of stakeholders. This has helped us to develop a growing understanding of the community's strengths as well as the areas that need our attention.

PIVOT. This year our world and our work changed quite dramatically. We had already recognized how important it is to be nimble and in fact had already revamped our granting process to reflect that. But oh boy, have we had to move fast lately. I am so proud of the team of staff and the Directors of the Board as we established a North Shore COVID-19 fund and were invited to distribute Government of Canada funds to the charitable sector serving vulnerable populations in North and West Vancouver. As the dust settles we were able to raise over \$500,000 in just over 2 months which has translated into 46 grants. And we know the needs will continue to grow.

GRATITUDE. I am honoured to serve this community as Chair of the WVF Board. We have a talented group of volunteer Directors who each contribute time, talent and treasure. A special note to a long-standing board member, Mark Ballard, who retired after a full nine years on the board. Mark did two incredible game changing things for us over those years – he helped form the culture of fun and he taught us the value of marketing and story-telling. Indeed, to not tell our story would be an injustice to the community. Thank you Mark. We are grateful to live in a community that is safe, generous, beautiful and caring. We must never take any of that for granted. Your West Vancouver Foundation seeks to make sure we stay that way.

We are committed to working with groups that serve all aspects of our community, providing needed services for vulnerable populations, and to help rebuild during recovery.

The West Vancouver Foundation is a leader in community-based philanthropy with three main priorities.

- Encourage community giving where individuals, families and companies can make a positive and lasting impact.
- Highlight the pressing needs facing our community through insights and engagement.
- Provide grants to support community initiatives funded through the generosity of our donors.

created the Henrik Moberg-Parker Excellence Fund - a scholarship fund to support excellence in youth sailing and honour the memory of this exceptional young man.

Community Grants Committee

In 2019 we issued 37 Community Grants and in 2020 we received over 70 grant applications. The grants committee spent many hours adjudicating the grant applications, ensuring that the generosity of donors is directed to the causes that inspire them and to the issues that matter most in West Vancouver, as identified by the 2019 Vital Signs report. Neighbourhood Small Grants

The Neighbourhood Small Grants (NSG) program is a grass-roots grant making program that helps build community and strengthen connections in West Vancouver. In 2019 there were 35 NSG projects ranging from emergency preparedness meetings to block parties, beach clean ups to a writers support circle. In 2020 the program was modified to the 'Responsive' NSG program, moving online and virtual, in response to COVID-19. The 2020 Resident Advisory Committee members are; Arzoo Babul, Hoon Choi, Eleanor Cramb, Lorna Duncan, Tamara Leger and ChiChi Wang.

North Shore COVID-19 Emergency Response Fund Donors

When the pandemic was declared in mid-March, we recognized that many vulnerable populations on the North Shore would be impacted and the charities providing services to those groups would be seeing a large increase in demand. In March the North Shore COVID-19 Emergency Response Fund was launched and in May the Emergency Community Support Fund, funded by the Government of Canada, began.

Over \$500,000 has been raised in donations from 120+ amazing community members, plus the Government of Canada. 46 grants have been issued to charities on the North Shore that are providing urgent services such as meal delivery programs to low income seniors, outreach programs for vulnerable youth, and crisis counselling services to those in need.

2019 was a year of continued growth for the West Vancouver Foundation. We started off the year with a generous donation from Rosemary and Ian Mottershead. Through the year we furthered our discussions with families, individuals and groups in the community to assist them in their giving programs. We expanded our community engagement to include youth & young adults, and issued our second comprehensive Vital Signs report examining the aspects of a liveable community. Building upon 2018, we further refined our process of community granting and also expanded the Neighbourhood Grants program allowing more groups to participate. Importantly, in this our 40th year, we also took time to celebrate the vital role of philanthropy in our community and the vision and hope that the Founding Board had for all of us in caring for each other.
